Councilman Suprenant: If you will be asking the Town for money you will need to submit a request in September of this year for next year's budget.

Kyle Cozzens: Is Mill Park used? Does the Town maintain it?

Councilman Suprenant: Yes, the Town maintains it and the people from the church used to play softball there on Saturdays. People also go down there to fish.

Councilman Middleton: We are actually considering asking one of the solar companies to upgrade that park as part of a host package.

Kyle Cozzens: What is the building?

Brian Brockway: That is cold storage for the Highway.
