BUSINESS:

WCC, LLC Subdivision

Mark Belden: We normally wouldn't meet without having new information 10 days in advance.

Mike O'Connor: We said at the last meeting we would have the new material on the 8th.

Letters:

NYSDEC and NYS Office of Parks and Recreation both responded to the Involved Agency Letters and agree to the Planning Board being Lead Agency.

Mike O'Connor: Presented the new map to the Board

6 lots:

Lots 1&2 - CRRC has an option on

Chairman Belden: Narrow Strip?

John Davidson: The strip is for access to the rail, to put an extension lead track in

BOARD:

Jim Houston: I did a brief review and the new site for the manufacturing plant did not go out to a road that had road frontage. When the road gets turned over you will then have frontage which is a positive change. The line on the right divides the school districts, can't have a lot that lies half in 1 school district and half in another.

Mike O'Connor: It keeps Kingsbury involved, there will have to be an Intermunicipal agreement with the road, and Kingsbury will get the benefit of school taxes.

Jim Houston: Lot 6: same owner but it's a separate lot and it does not have frontage, also there is a formation of a lot for the actual track itself.

Mary-Ellen Stockwell: Do you have any easements?

Mike O'Connor: You want us to do an easement from ourselves to ourselves?

Mary-Ellen Stockwell: Or a Variance

- The applicant made a suggestion about placing a note on the plat, lots without road frontage will only be sold with lots that have frontage. Lot 2 would go with lot 1 and 5 and 6 together unless other access was provided.

Jim Houston: That would resolve the issue

Mary-Ellen Stockwell: We are here looking at the subdivision maps, site plan is forth coming. We sent out lead agency letters, 30 days expires on the 20th prior to our 22nd meeting. We were going to send this to the County Planning Board before that but they don't have jurisdiction over subdivision but if a site plan comes in they will review it. I had raised concerns about segmentation of SEQRA.

Mike O'Connor: You don't need another resolution to refer to the county. When Paul gets the application to you it can be referred without another resolution. We discussed setting a potential public hearing for the March 22^{nd} meeting.

Pat Mitchell: We have started on the site plan for the facility; I have a very early drawing of what is proposed.

Chairman Belden: Power, water. Natural gas?

John Davidson: We have capacity to service the facility with power and natural gas

Mary-Ellen Stockwell: This Board hasn't been introduced to what you are doing on the property, employees, etc.

Mike O'Connor: That will be included in the site plan.

Pat Mitchell: Water and sewage is based on employees, 150-200 employees

Jim Houston: Does that water feed the lot owned by WCC? How are you maintaining the line that is coming in, Transportation Corporation?

Paul Goldman: Transportation Corporation or an agreement between the 2 owners, whatever we have to do to make it legally correct will be done.

Chairman Belden: Do you for see anything in your site plan changing your subdivision maps?

- Need to talk with NYSDOT early on for the best way to get the cars there

Paul Goldman: They were listed as an involved agency and we will be doing a traffic study

Chairman Belden: Coming in by train or truck?

Pat Mitchell: There has been talk of both, large parts will be brought in and complete the car here and ship it back out by rail or truck.

Max Fruchter: New or refurbished?

Paul Goldman: New

Max Fruchter: Will they be treating the axels since they will be coming from overseas?

John Davidson: I have no idea

Max Fruchter: There is a potential for some waste product

Zachary Middleton: How many tracks in the rail bed?

John Davidson: Just a single track

Zachary Middleton: How are you delivering by rail then?

Paul Goldman: That will be included in the site plan

Frank Wells: What are you testing?

Paul Goldman: How they move down the track before they go to NYC, the test track is that long to get them up to speed and then back down.

John Davidson: It saves the MTA from having to test the cars, it's cheaper also

Terry Middleton: Now they will get a tested car thus eliminating that one step. It makes the company more competitive.

Valerie Ingersoll: Is each car tested individually?

John Davidson: Yes

Paul Goldman: Noise is less than a railcar significantly, at the testing speed.

Max Fruchter: Is it a nationally certified track?

Paul Goldman: I will get that information
