

DCO Report October 2024

I do not contract with WCPH to handle 10 day QT bite reports. I do keep track of all reported bites in the town.

I have started attendance for the New York State Veterinary Conference held by Cornell School of Veterinary Medicine.. The information in some of the seminars is helpful when a resident calls to ask me advice on something going on with their pet. The nutrition information I am learning helps me help them make good choices for their pet that may help with other issues. The medical information helps me to direct them to a good vet in the area for the issue they are looking for help with. I am earning CE credits by attending this conference. I attended last year and I was the only ACO/DCO in the state of NY to attend. The school has informed me I am the only one this year as well. They allowed me to sign up as a student to receive the best possible price for the seminar as this year there were no scholarships to apply for to help defray the cost.. The conference is available for attendance until mid December and I will attend as many seminars as possible.

10/2- Received a call from a WCS looking for assistance with a dead cat he found on Broadway. I directed him to the road crews who handle these issues.

10/3- I received a call from a resident on RT 4 whose pet goat passed away. He was asking how he could get help disposing of it. I gave him some information on local people who handle these issues.

10/9- I received a call from a woman on Dennis Ave who was very upset that her dog had gotten loose. She was out in her car trying to find and catch the dog. As we were speaking and making a plan for me to come assist her, the dog showed up and jumped into her car.

10/14- I received a call from a woman on Prospect St who was upset that her niece's dog come into her yard to go to the bathroom and run around. The yards of their property back up to each other from what she described to me. The more she spoke and told me the easier it was to see this is a family dispute that goes much deeper then the issue with the dog. I sent her the complaint form to fill out and sign. I explained to her that once that was done I would start by sending a warning letter to her niece. She agreed that it was a good plan to do things by the book. She has not yet returned the complaint form.

10/16- I received an email and phone call from a man in Fort Edward who stated he found a dog with the name tag 'Loverboy' on his collar. The rabies tag was to Battenkill Vet and the phone number of the owner was no longer in service. The dog was posted online while I got ready to come pick it up and the owner was located in Cossayuna. A family member had been keeping the dog and it had gotten away from them.

10/16- I received a call from Jessica , the kennel manager, at Lucky Puppy Adoption Center in Argyle. She said 2 women dumped off a dog they claimed to have found in Fort Edward on the road. I recognized the dog right away.. The 2 women are from Greenwich and this was their dog. I had been dealing with them for the past 2 weeks. The Argyle DCO picked up the dog and I notified the WCS that the case had taken a turn. They are now handling this issue.

10/21- I received a call from an elderly couple on Dennis Ave looking for assistance. They have 2 dogs who are not getting along. I explained that dog control is not a rescue and can not take a private surrender. I gave them several numbers of local dog rescues to try calling. For now the dogs are being kept in separate parts of the house to avoid any further scuffles until a rescue has room to take one of them.

10/24- I received a call from a WCS deputy who had gotten a call from a woman in an apartment on Chestnut St. She stated her boyfriend moved out a year ago, left his 2 dogs, and she no longer wanted to care for them. He texted her that he was not going to return to pick them up and she should rehome them. I spoke to her current partner and gave them several options on how to proceed. I explained that dog control is not a rescue and can not take private surrenders of dogs. She understood. I have spoken to this family before about this issue and let the deputy know this.

10/25- I received a call from a woman on Blodgett Rd. She said her neighbor's GSD is coming into her yard again. This woman called earlier in the spring and I sent a warning letter to the neighbor. The issue stopped. I informed her due to the amount of time that has passed we should start over with a new complaint. She agreed and I am awaiting the return of the complaint form.

10/28- I received a call from a woman who needs to find a home for her younger dog. The woman is pregnant and the dogs have begun to resource guard her whenever she is in the room and fighting with each other. The younger dog is a 1 yr old purebred unfixed Great Dane. She has never re-homed an animal and was concerned with how to do it right and find the dog a good home where she won't be used for breeding. If a rescue can take the dog in she is willing to make a donation toward getting the dog spayed. The dog is already UTD on all shots. I reached out to a contact at a local rescue who agreed to help find the dog a home. It is not often the owner is willing to help out and I was glad I was able to assist this resident. Most of the time the dog is placed on a waiting list because the local rescues are maxed out and can't afford to take on the dog and its vet bills to make it adoptable. This resident was willing to help and made all the difference for her dog.

Perform Interior Inspection

- Please note, our Remote Operated Vehicle (ROV) unit requires, at minimum, a 16" diameter manway/opening.
- The interior in-service inspection will be performed using our ROV Inspection Robot and the exterior will be inspected by our personnel trained in OSHA regulations utilizing fall protection equipment. **Tank is to remain full during internal inspection.**
- This inspection will check for deficiencies and meet tank inspection requirements of OSHA, EPA, AWWA and NFPA. All structural, sanitary, safety, security and coating conditions will be reviewed. Items examined will include ladders, shell, roof, vent, manways, welds, seams, foundation, anchors, safety systems, hatch, and external overflow. Any emergency items will be brought to Owner's attention by our Inspector personnel.
- Owner will receive a detailed written report of findings with photographs, video of inspection, corrective recommendations and cost estimates.
- The following tests shall be performed during the inspection: Lead check – Interior & Exterior (Only applicable to tanks erected prior to 1990), Mil thickness test (coating thickness) – Exterior only, Cross hatch test (paint adhesion) – Exterior only, Ultra-sonic test of tank shell – Exterior only. ***If the tank is insulated, these tests are limited to exposed tank accessories only. Ultra-sonic thickness testing or mil readings of the shell or roof would require sections of the insulation to be removed to allow for proper testing. On spray foam insulated tanks, we will cut out various sections of foam to allow for the readings to be taken and the areas will then be repaired with aerosol foam cans. Panel insulated tanks will be repaired by installing inspection ports that will allow for continued use on future inspections. This would be done at an additional cost per port.**

Please Note: In the event it becomes necessary to drain the tank once we are on site, draining shall be performed by Owner.

Minimum Codes for Inspections NFPA 25-2014 AWWA M-42 2013

- **NFPA 25-2014; 9.2.6.1.1** States, "The interior of steel tanks without corrosion protection shall be inspected every 3 years."
- **NFPA 25-2014; 9.2.6.1.2** States, "The interior of all other types of tanks shall be inspected every 5 years."
- **NFPA 25-2014; 9.4.5** States, "Silt shall first be removed during interior inspections or more frequently, as needed, to avoid accumulation to the level of the tank outlet."
- **AWWA M-42-2013 Periodic Inspection** States, "The tank should be inspected at least once every 3 to 5 years or as required by state regulatory agencies. A drained "dry" evaluation or an underwater evaluation performed by robotic inspection are popular methods."
- **AWWA M-42 2013 Tank Washouts** states, "Tanks should be washed out and inspected at least once every 3 years, and where water supplies have sediment problems, annual washouts are recommended."

DISINFECTION PROCEDURE FOR "ROV INSPECTION UNIT"

1. Once our crew arrives on site, a chlorine solution made of ¾ water and ¼ chlorine bleach is mixed in a plastic spray bottle.
2. The ROV unit is removed from the case and placed on plastic. An inspection crew member, wearing plastic latex gloves, then sprays thoroughly the plastic and all exterior portions of the ROV unit using the chlorine solution.
3. A plastic bag is then also thoroughly sprayed on the outside and inside with the same chlorine solution. The ROV unit is then immediately placed into the plastic bag and the bag is tied secure.
4. The unit remains in the bag until the crew completes the external portion of the tank inspection.
5. When time for the internal inspection, the unit is carried to the top of the tank, removed from the plastic bag and placed in the water.

- 1) Prior to start of work, Owner will be furnished a certificate of insurance covering Workman's Compensation, Occupational Disease, Employer's Liability, and General Liability.
- 2) If tank is to be drained prior to our arrival, it shall be drained by owner, if it becomes necessary to drain the tank while on site, it must be drained by the Owner/Customer.
- 3) If needed a pressure release valve will be furnished during the cleaning and painting operation. Owner required to notify PTTM prior to mobilization if required.
- 4) In the event interior and/or exterior complete tank repainting is not included in this scope of work, all new tank appurtenances furnished and installed by PTTM as part of this scope of work shall be field primed and finish coated to match existing coating system(s), unless specifically excluded from our scope of work. Color to match as close as possible.
- 5) No paint shall be applied during wet, damp, or inclement weather.
- 6) All paint will be delivered to the job site in original containers with contents identified by the manufacturer.
- 7) If necessary, customer will be required to clear/move vehicles and equipment a safe distance from the job site to prevent damage and place physical barricades around the perimeter to restrict access.
- 8) Work to be performed using our standard wage scale with Open Shop personnel, by mechanics skilled in their trade.
- 9) All workmanship is guaranteed for twelve (12) months after completion.
- 10) Owner is to provide dumpster(s) for trash, paint consumables, blast media, and all other waste produced during course of job, including disposal of said waste.
- 11) Handling, removal, and/or disposal of hazardous or contaminated material (e.g., asbestos, lead, chemicals, heavy metals, etc.) requiring special handling or transportation to a specific disposal site are not included in the submitted quotation for work.
